



Ever eager and opportunistic to improve in mathematics, Grade 5 students Nathan L. Huervana and Mary Fame Fiara Plotea, alongside Yosef Mateo Espregante, took a chance to partake in a math training course in Iloilo National High School in order to partake in the 2025 elementary Math Olympics.

"I need more knowledge. More. Knowledge.", said Nathan

with regards to his motivation for joining the Math Olympics.

...I was so nervous...the questions were so tough...[I focused and answered the test regardless.] I did not expect [to get Gold]."

While Mary, preferring to be called Fiara, said, "[Math] improves one's critical thinking, and because [it is] fun.", when asked about her motivations and expectations.

"But my [journey] does not stop here, and this is just the beginning.", said Fiara

when asked about how she felt about winning the Bronze medal.

But they weren't alone. They were unsure at first, concerned about how comfortable they would be in this new environment, but the trio would come together to both learn and compete alongside many other schools that sent representatives as well, such as those from Ateneo Iloilo, among others, according to Nathan. As far as he could remember, he was drilled into learning a variety of entry-level advanced mathematical techniques such as calculating decimals, geometry, basic physics, and learning how to compute the Greatest and Least Common Factors.



Fiara realized that math was involved in far more than just equations, but in daily activities such as gardening and shopping, much to her delight.

IICMS is proud to have not one, but two medal winning students for a high-production multischool competition like the Math Olympics, and it is a clear sign of their potential and natural talent.




